



TAKE CARE

When MPTF says we take care of our own, that means every generation our industry touches from the children of workers to parents and retirees. 2022 saw several inspiring examples of how different age groups in the community are all a part of our mission, from benefiting from our services to banding together to help others.

A Mother and Son's Love

Local 700 member Shaun Burdick. who works in sound editing, found his life changing drastically when his mother, Martha, who lived in New Hampshire, lost her husband in 2022 and was injured in a fall. She moved to California to be with him, but the challenges of coordinating her health needs and doctor's appointments with his work schedule were intimidating. At UCLA Toluca Lake Health Center. Shaun's doctor recognized his new role as a caregiver and suggested he contact MPTF for help. That's when he was referred to one of our social workers, Carly Castaneda, LCSW.

"As an Elder Connection social worker, I was able to help Shaun establish eligibility for services with us at MPTF, assess his needs, address his questions and ultimately connect him and Martha to services and programs at MPTF, and I've been working with them ever since," says Carly of our unique program providing comprehensive social services to qualified industry members aged 65 and older, as well as parents of qualified industry members. Soon Shaun was able to get back to his five-day work schedule; as he explains, "My boss is really cool about doing whatever I need to help her out. The pandemic helped me get my place ready since I prepped my own home to be able to work during lockdown."

In the process, our social worker Carly helped Martha acquire the insurance she needed as a new California resident to meet her health care needs and provided them with support for the transition they were both experiencing. "Most of my clients are retired industry members, their spouses and families," Carly says, "but we also



provide services to working-age clients like Shaun who have aging parents and don't necessarily know what to do with some of the issues that they face. He became a caregiver overnight. It was important to know the goals of both Shaun and his mother and to be able to be a listening ear for both. This allowed us to create a comprehensive case plan based on their needs, which included linking them to community resources, supporting him in his new role as a caregiver and formalizing advanced care planning. As concerns about her complex health challenges arose, we also referred them to MPTF Palliative Care program." The ultimate goal was to make sure Shaun and his mother knew they were not alone in this journey.

"How do you provide care and take care of yourself at the same time?" That's a guestion Elder Connection and our other social workers address with cases like this, which gets even more complicated when it involves the many time and energy factors of working in the entertainment industry. Carly explains, "We work closely with industry members and their parents with the aim of providing emotional support to reduce caregiver stress and explore the client's goals and care needs. We provide advocacy and guidance to help them understand their options and what's available to them. Most people are not used to navigating health care options or an aging parent's psychosocial needs. We hope through our professional lens these conversations provide guidance, relief, and peace of mind. A lot of working-age people don't know they can access these services and think they're only for older adults. We're here to take the journey with you, help you plan ahead and answer any questions you may have."

Our Community

"We're in!" said Olivia Brooks from the Creative Artists Agency Foundation (CAA) when she heard about MPTF's Annual Holiday Food Drive in December. In past years, according to Fredda Johnson, MPTF Director of Engagement, there would be one group who donated the food, another wrapping the boxes, and a third delivering them across Los Angeles. In 2022, CAA enthusiastically donated thousands of pounds of food, books, and DVDs for MPTF clients in the community. Almost 100 CAA employees came to our campus outside the Saban Center for Health and Wellness for a whole day of sorting, packing, card-making, wrapping, delivering, and visiting those who needed some holiday cheer.

"We're so happy to be giving back to the incredible people of the entertainment industry," said CAA's Nicole Brookman during the busy day on December 15. "MPTF does such great work, and we're thrilled to be part of the journey. One of my colleagues let me know she spent 3 hours visiting clients on her delivery run and that her life is forever changed from that special experience. The impact is immeasurable, and it was a pleasure to play a small part in it!"

Comes Together

One of the food drive recipients in the community and in fact someone MPTF has helped with many of our services in recent years, was Jerome Blackwell, a longtime SAG-AFTRA member. With a career going back to roles on classic TV shows like Hill Street Blues, Airwolf, Falcon Crest, and The White Shadow, he's a recognizable character actor with a cheerful disposition and a conversational way with words.

Since his wife Doris was diagnosed with terminal cancer many years ago, Jerome turned to MPTF for the wide array of services we offer. Our volunteers and social services teams have been instrumental in helping him with necessities and access to health needs, with Thanksgiving and Christmas boxes this year including everything from mashed potatoes and oatmeal to shampoo.

Unfortunately, she also experienced issues with tinnitus and PTSD from her service—but the VA paperwork proved insurmountable when she went back to civilian life. Currently working as a writer's assistant on a military-related project for Sony-Netflix executive produced by MPTF supporter and World War II veteran Norman Lear, she didn't know where to begin to untangle the web of paperwork necessary to receiving the full benefits to which she was entitled.

Through the Local 871 newsletter, Melissa found out about MPTF and our Veterans Benefits Assistance Program, which provides assistance in securing pension benefits for our industry's military veterans, their surviving spouses, or industry members' parents with military service. In 2022, we screened 943 veterans and surviving spouses, recovering \$253,916.18 in retroactive benefits and \$28,884.15 in ongoing benefits. To find out more, visit mptf.com/veterans-assistance.

awarded a disability rating, which I'd never even heard of before," Melissa explains. "Don't be shy about setting up a consultation, even if it's been a while since you separated," she says about others who served or their family members. "Especially if you're a female veteran. Speak with a counselor and/or medical professional because you just don't know what you don't know. I wish I would've taken advantage of the MPTF's veterans advocacy services earlier, but I'm grateful I was made aware of the MPTF program. I hope my experience helps other veterans take the initial step to see what benefits might be available to them as well.

Heading into its third year on the air, MPTF Studios' Creative Chaos continued to bring together residents, supporters, and our friends throughout the entertainment community for hours of live programming every week. Harry Northup's weekly poetry hour, meditation and urban zen, happy hours, workouts, and much more filled the schedule, while Hawk Koch interviewed guests like James Burrows, Tony Bill, Bert Fields, Jane Lynch, Elliott Gould, and Mike Medavoy.

MPTF Studios also held its 6th annual Instant Film Festival, which celebrates intergenerational creativity with a single day of residents, college students, volunteers, and industry professionals working side-by-side to create a 1 to 5-minute short film. From conception to screening and an awards presentation, it's a fun and fast-paced day for all, with students from Emerson LA and the BAFTA Outreach Program as well as local high schools and middle schools joining in.

A special friendship was forged on campus that led to the familiar sight of a pair of motorized wheelchairs cruising around outside. Dave Pierce, who worked for nearly 30 years in studio transportation as a member of Local 399, met a nearby MPTF neighbor, Steven Reynolds, who was in sound recording for over four decades. Born in Glendale and a football player in high school, Dave was in a physical rehab facility in his birth town when his sister tipped him off about moving to our campus. Originally from Oregon, Steven had been at three nursing homes over two years when he came here. The two started playing cards together, frequently joined by a volunteer, loved exploring the campus, and watching football - "college or pro"including a Super Bowl watch party together.

"Being part of residents' lives is very special to me," says their social worker, Tiffany Lawrence, MSW, "but watching them create special friendships and bonds while in a Long Term Care setting warms my heart. It's also a true blessing that they want me to be a part of it." These connections that form here at MPTF are always full of surprises, and we look forward to seeing where Dave and Steven's wheels take them next!



foster living and aging well thanks to Innovation Manager Carly Roman, PhD, a gerontologist who provides hands-on support through classes and one-on-one sessions. "Teaching a resident how to attach a file to an email so they can stay in touch with family or participate in MPTF programs like Grey Quill Society makes their lives easier," she says, "and shows skills." Providing residents with a safe space to ask questions about their smartphones or how to use the internet is a critical first step in helping learn technology skills. Since February of 2022, MPTF has been part of the AARP-affiliated Senior Planet Licensing Pilot Program, which provides staff and volunteers training and curriculum to teach in-person tech classes where residents learn about mobile devices, computer use, online shopping, security, telemedicine, Zoom calling, and more. Carly also works with our Engagement, Innovation, and Recreation teams on these classes, plus a monthly Tech Tips show on Creative Chaos and a "Tech Table" every other Saturday for residents on campus with mother/daughter volunteer teams from the National Charity League.





"I have a feeling we might be together forever." That's something Lauren Dow heard on her first date with Tony Dow, who became her husband for life in 1980. Famous as Wally Cleaver on the classic TV show Leave It to Beaver and its 1980s revival series, Tony was in Kansas City, Missouri doing a play when his life changed forever. Then Lauren Shulkind, she was working for an advertising agency who wanted to feature Tony in a McDonald's commercial. The meeting turned out to be love at first sight, and they built a life together including a beautiful home in Topanga Canyon where they lived with several much-loved canine companions. Tony went on to pursue his artistic passion as a sculptor, with his striking work exhibited in numerous galleries around the country.

Tony and Lauren's MPTF connections reach far and wide including their decades-long friendship with entertainment manager Phil Gittelman, who had Tony as one of his first clients. A longtime MPTF resident, Phil dined at their home on countless occasions and featured them on his long-running show on MPTF Studios' Creative Chaos, The Original Foodie. In the mid-'90s, Lauren decided to volunteer and discovered how she could do it with MPTF. As she explains, "I started because of my husband's involvement in the business. I love older people. My mother was a volunteer for 45 years, and I hope I'm following in her footsteps in some way." From party decorating to working at Harry's Haven, where she used activities like singing to help deal with memory loss, Lauren, an MPTF Guild Volunteer, not only found a home away from home but brought Tony into the volunteering fold as well.

Lauren also teamed up with writer-philanthropist Betty Freeman to start a writing workshop and created a book in 2005, Behind the Silver Screen: Stories from Residents of the Motion Picture & Television Fund Retirement Community, which in turn inspired an ongoing on-campus TV series originally hosted by Joe Sutton.

Over the years Lauren and Tony lived a rich life filled with adventures including extensive traveling and multi-city performances together of the beloved stage play, Love Letters. Tony never lost his connection with the industry that had defined his childhood. As Lauren remembers, "He knew so many people, and everyone knew and loved Tony Dow. One day we were walking to the soundstage and this big Cadillac goes whizzing by. Then the guy slams on the brake, backs up, and screams, 'Hey, Tony!' 'Hey, Burt Reynolds!'"


